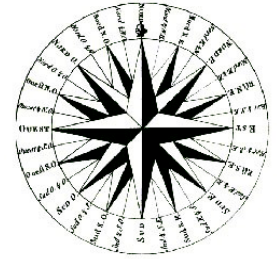

Getty Thesaurus of Geographic Names®



TGN, the Getty Thesaurus of Geographic Names®, includes names, relationships, dates, sources, and coordinates for current & historical cities, nations, empires, archaeological sites, & physical features.

- TGN is multilingual
- The scope is global; it ranges from prehistory to the present
- TGN focuses on places important to art and material culture
- Major subdivisions include current continents and nations
- TGN includes historical cities, nations, and empires
- TGN includes real places, not mythical or legendary
- However, TGN includes formerly inhabited places and historical places with unknown exact locations (i.e., “lost settlements”)
- TGN is a thesaurus, compliant with international standards for thesaurus construction; it contains hierarchical (polyhierarchical), equivalence, & associative relationships
- TGN includes current and historical relationships
- TGN is not a GIS (Geographic Information System), but may be linked to maps & GIS
- TGN grows through contributions from the expert user and scholar communities
- Contributors and sources are cited
