# WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

**Los Liones Drive Closure** Due to roadway improvements on Los Liones Drive Wednesday, July 7–Friday, July 9, the road will be closed to all traffic 6 a.m.–5 p.m. on those days. We ask staff to enter the Villa via the PCH Gate and exit via the Coastline Gate during that time. We sincerely apologize for the inconvenience and appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

**Staff Meals** Since the Center and Villa have reopened and we are beginning to return to normal operations, we will also return to charging staff for meals and coffee. This will begin on July 6 at the Center and July 7 at the Villa. The Center Restaurant will reopen on July 20.

**New Metro Line 761** Metro Line 734 has been discontinued, and Line 234 is now limited to travel north of Ventura Blvd. For the purposes of traveling to the Getty Center, both have been replaced by the new Metro Line 761. Line 761 operates between the Sylmar/San Fernando Metrolink Station and the E Line Expo/Sepulveda Station, between the San Fernando Valley and the Westside, via Van Nuys Boulevard, Ventura Boulevard and Sepulveda Boulevard, including frequent service all day on weekdays and weekends. You can make an appointment now in Reservio, our self-scheduling reservation system, for any of these dates. We are no longer offering curbside book pickup.

Please note that curbside service hours are 10 a.m.–2 p.m., with five-minute appointment times. Please park at the designated location and walk over to the labeled book cart on the sidewalk to return your books.
