## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

**Vaccine Second Dose On Site** As a reminder, employees, docents, volunteers, contract staff, and family members who received their first shot of the Pfizer vaccine through Curative, on site at the Getty Center on August 2, have their second dose scheduled for Monday, August 30, beginning at 9 a.m. The vaccines will again be taking place at the P1 level of NEP. Please be sure to bring photo identification, your medical insurance card (if you have one), and your COVID-19 vaccination card to your appointment.
