WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Onsite Vaccine Verification and COVID Testing: Be Prepared and Pack Your

Patience As more and more staff are returning to our worksites and presenting proof of vaccines or receiving COVID tests, please be aware that there is one nurse at our sites (see <u>schedule on GO</u>). To help keep things running smoothly:

- Register before you go and have your QR code available (print your code or save it as a
 picture on your mobile device). The process takes longer if the nurse has to look you up in the
 system.
- Don't show up in groups; or if you do, expect that you may not get through the process quickly.
- Mondays and Tuesdays are the busiest days, so if you are presenting proof of vaccination or getting a COVID test but are not *required* to do so, consider coming on a Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.
- If you are required to get a COVID test, you must do so the first day you are on site and then weekly thereafter.
- If you have not presented your proof of vaccination, please do so in the first week you return to the site.
- The nurse will focus on people one at a time. Allow them to finish before talking with a colleague, speaking to the nurse, or stepping up to the nurse's station.

Updated Return to Worksite & COVID FAQs After receiving a few more questions, we added some <u>additional information to the FAQs</u>, as we continue to increase the numbers of staff at our Getty locations. We are pleased to share that 80% of employees, plus more than 80% of our contracted staff with Bon Appetit and Uniserve, are fully vaccinated. We expect to see those numbers increase as more people are on site and provide proof of their vaccination.

Access to Copyrighted Items via HathiTrust Ends September 1 When the Getty Library temporarily closed and we were unable to circulate physical books and other materials, HathiTrust, in response to the COVID-19 emergency, created an Emergency Temporary Access Service (ETAS). ETAS made over 40,000 print titles in the Getty Library available digitally to Getty staff. As we resume providing access to the print collection, the conditions for the fair use of digital copies end and so does our access to this service. Please return to accessing the library's print collection in the usual ways.

Copyrighted items will still be available for full-text search in the HathiTrust Digital Library and can be helpful in the creation of a bibliography. You may continue to access HathiTrust items in the public domain or through Creative Commons licensing. These titles are marked "Full view" in the online catalog. Because Getty is a HathiTrust member, you may log in to HathiTrust using your GettyOneID login and password and download full PDFs of those items.

Holiday Weekend Timecards Monday, September 6, is not only a holiday but also the deadline for timecard approvals for the period ending September 4, 2021. Please make sure you approve your own timecard on your last workday of the pay period. For some employees that may be Thursday, September 2, Friday, September 3, or Saturday, September 4.
